Profile of the College

Bhawanipur Anchalik College is one of the nerve centres of Higher Education in the vast rural area of Bhawanipur, Assam. It was in the year 1982; this premier institute of Higher Education was initially started in the premises of Bhawanipur Primary Health Centre. The establishment of Bhawanipur Anchalik College was possible mainly due to the contributions and hard work of the people of Bhawanipur and its adjoining areas. The college was shifted to its present site in 1984. The institution is located on the western side of 31 No National Highway, 2 kilometres from Bhawanipur Chowk Bazar and four kilometres from Sarupeta Railway Station. Bhawanipur Anchalik College was affiliated with Gauhati University in 1991 and was brought under the deficit grants-in-aid system of the State Government in 1996. The College is being managed by a Governing Body constituted under the management rules of the Department of Higher Education, Government of Assam, India. Bhawanipur Anchalik College has been included in 2f and 12(B), Registration Act of UGC in January 2006. The college has been maintaining a good record of performance in the Council and University Examinations.

In the year 2012, the Governing Body with a thorough scrutiny of the demand of the locality planned to apply for permission from the University of Gauhati to open Commerce Stream. As per the planning, an application was submitted and the university, after official inspection, granted permission to open Commerce Stream by its official Memo No. GU/AFF/2012/2315-18, Dated 11- 06-12. Thus, the college has made proper provisions for Commerce education since 2013 for the students of the greater Bhawanipur Area in specific and Assam, India in general. The college has been allotted **Science Stream** by the Government of Assam. Director of Higher Education Vide Letter No. PC/HE/Misc.117/2018/167 Dated Kahilipara, the 15th of October, 2022. However, the classes are not started till now in this stream.

20. Overall Observations and Recommendations

On invitation, the Gauhati University Academic Audit team comprising two senior Professors visited Bhabanipur Anchalik College, Bhabanipur on 30.03.2023 and conducted the first Academic Audit from 9,00 am to 5.30 am.

About the College:

Observations and Remarks:

During the visit, Principal, Vice Principal and Coordinator of Academic Audit and Coordinator of IQAC apprised the team on various academic aspects of the College and facilitate the team to visit all departments, centres and facilities. The members had department-wise detailed interactions on points necessary for a healthy teaching-learning environment. The Committee's focal points for these interactions were guided by the matrix that will be assessed by NAAC, which the College authority is contemplating to invite shortly. Overall, the Committee is happy to see the positive developments in the College even in the pandemic situation and consequent countrywide lockdown.

Out of a total of 38 faculty members, 9 are with Ph. D. degrees, and this is about 23.6% of the total faculty.

It is noted with concern that a few Departments are running with very limited faculty members against sanctioned posts which needs to be strengthened considering the student influx in recent years.

The College has the provision of recording data on the Class register, student progression and alumni in each department which the committee feels is a good academic practice. The record-keeping of some departments needs to be improved.

But, the publications of the majority of the members are not in good/standard journals and books. The committee suggest not to waste time and energy for the sake of number. Research enthusiasm is found to be missing amongst the senior faculty members. The Committee, therefore, suggest submitting research proposals to various financial organizations and urges the faculty members to increase their publications.

The College has the provision to encourage the faculty members to participate in the FDPs and RC, OC etc.

However, compared to the number of faculty members, participation in such courses are very negligible. College should take steps to increase such participation.

The Committee is happy to note that in some departments the pass percentage is more than 80% in major subjects. A good number of students could secure first class in University examinations from the college, which is laudable. The committee is worried about the fact that the overall pass percentage in general courses is not satisfactory.

It is very satisfying to notice that almost 70 per cent of the faculty members are trained in the use of ICT, specifically in the use of the Internet in teaching-learning. Very encouraging to see that a few faculty members are actively engaged in the preparation of e-contents in the form of ppt and video lectures. These contents are disseminated among the students, which was very helpful during the lockdown period. The Committee only wishes that the contents prepared will constantly be upgraded and put to use. The ICT classroom facility of the College is commendable.

The college has one Computer lab with dedicated browsing centres and a good language laboratory. The college is trying to generate some resources by offering a few self-financing courses. The tailoring course offered in the college is a good initiative.

The College Library has been provided with all modern settings. The library is run on SOUL 2.0 software. The student-support and counselling for "how to use the college library" is a regular practice that we assume is a good student-friendly practice of the College. The reading room ambience is good.

The faculty with active encouragement from the IQAC prepared the Lesson Plans for each of the courses. However, the IQAC of the college needs to be strengthened to lead the college team during the ensuing NAAC visit.

The College and the individual departments also organised several such programmes, which is commendable. The College Canteen is good but there is scope for improvement. From the students' welfare side, the College has an indoor stadium and girls' common room. The committee is pleased to see the activities of NSS. These can be treated as the best practices of the college for the welfare of students and staff members.

The hostel facilities of the college are up-to-date. The green campus of the college is an asset for the college.

Specific Suggestions:

The committee feels it is a duty to offer certain suggestions for the improvement of the academic atmosphere of the college. However, these are not stand-alone; rather they would be a part of the continuous efforts of the faculty members and administration of the college in their relentless pursuit towards achieving the highest academic standard.

- A lesson plan may be prepared based on the PO-CO matrix for all programmes.
- More Student wellness programmes incorporating Yoga etc. along may be started.
- It is suggested to maintain students' progression records along with their performances.
- Efforts may be initiated on an urgent basis for improvement of the pass percentage in general courses (and some major subjects).
- A database on slow learners may be kept ready. Maybe some more remedial classes/doubt-clearing sessions/one-to-one contact counselling arranged at a time mutually convenient for faculty and such struggling students. Moreover, there should be active initiatives for identifying slow learners at the beginning of the session with adequate evidence.
- Departments may be awarded based on their performances.
- Research works should be promoted among the faculty and they may be encouraged to publish in more reputed Journals. To create a more conducive publication atmosphere in the college, best researcher awards may be instituted for the faculty members.
- Faculty members may be encouraged to publish more books through a peer review mechanism,
- If budget permits every faculty should be allotted a PC with a dedicated LAN connection.
- Facilities of girls' common room should be improved.
- Teachers may still be encouraged to take part in more quality improvement programmes offered by reputed institutions even in offline mode without disrupting the regular academic activities.
- Students Satisfaction Surveys should be conducted regularly may be after the completion of each Semester so that the issues, if any of the previous Semester could be traced and resolved.
- Though the College has tremendous potential, full dedication is expected from every faculty member to bring laurels to the College.
