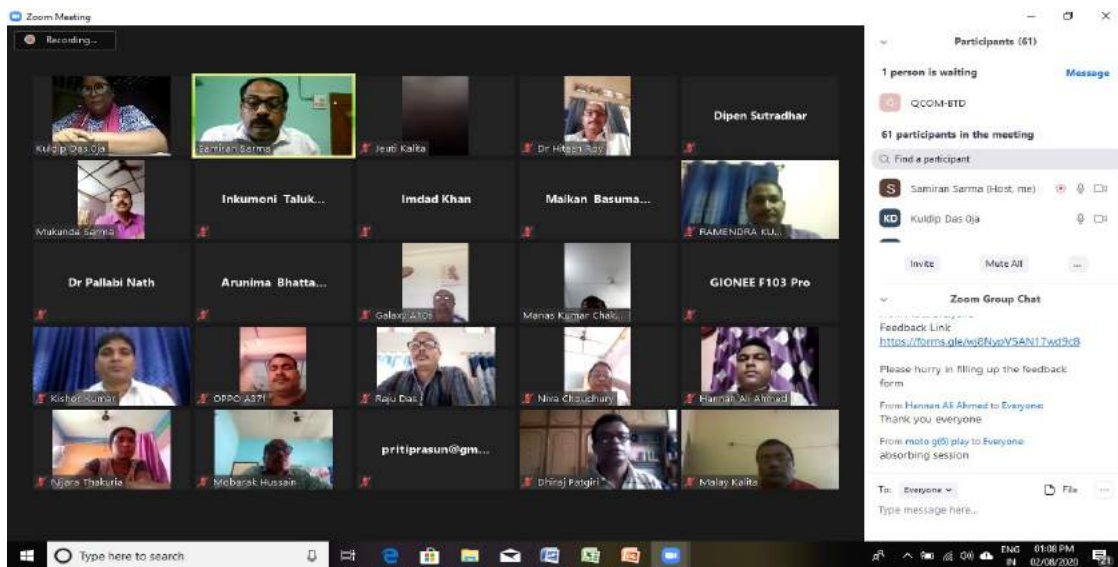

ABOUT THE STATE OF ASSAM
Assam is a state in northeastern India, situated south of the eastern Himalayas along the Brahmaputra and Barak River valleys. Assam covers an area of 78,438 km². As per the 2011 census, the total population of Assam was 31,169,272. The state is bordered by Bhutan and Arunachal Pradesh to the north; Nagaland and Manipur to the east; Meghalaya, Tripura, Mizoram and Bangladesh to the south; and West Bengal to the west via the Siliguri Corridor, a 23 kilometre strip of land that connects the state to the rest of India. It is also one of the world's most populous subdivisions. Assamese is the official and most common language. Assam is known for Assam tea and Assam silk. The state was the first site for oil drilling in Asia.^[12] Assam is home to the one-horned Indian rhinoceros, along with the wild water buffalo, pygmy hog, tiger and various species of Asiatic birds, and provides one of the last wild habitats for the Asian elephant. The Assamese economy is aided by wildlife tourism to Kaziranga National Park and Manas National Park, which are World Heritage Sites. Orlus-Sukhowa National Park is famed for its feral horses. Sal tree forests are found in the state which, as a result of abundant rainfall, look green all year round.

Since the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic in March 2020, English language teachers have had what might be described as a difficult relationship with technology. Initial teacher education has been slow to embrace digital ways of teaching and learning, meaning that many teachers feel that they have been poorly prepared to use technology in their teaching. Understandably, there are a number of worries which teachers have regarding introducing technology into teaching. The most common are: technology is isolating the learner's interaction, and dissimilar to the kind of ways that they will be required to use language in the real world. Moreover, teachers are being deskilled, and the essence of teaching is being lost. The rise of technology, particularly Artificial Intelligence will soon mean that teachers are made redundant. Teaching is a complex job, requiring a wide range of skill such as subject knowledge, classroom management, motivational skills, delivering feedback, differentiating learning, problem solving emotional intelligence, counselling and most importantly at this moment knowledge of technology. Therefore, a clear and immediate necessity for professional development in English language & literature teaching through technology for many teachers around the world.

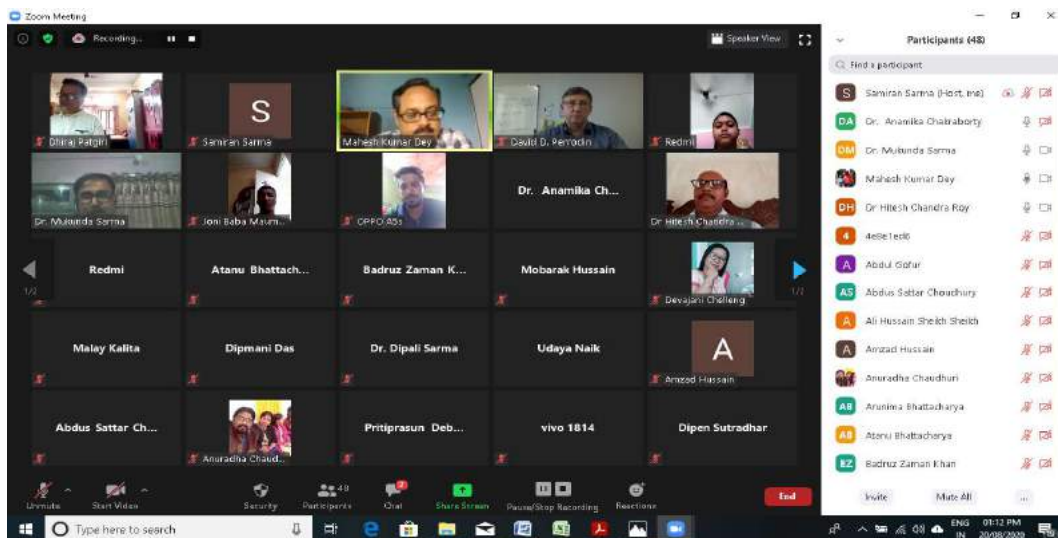
