Bhawanipur Anckalik College was established at Bhawanipur, an Assamese Vaisnava Sattrā in 1982 with a view to propagating the higher education amongst the rural poverty stricken masses, providing accessibility of women to higher education and elevating the people of Bhawanipur and its adjoining areas to the new horizon of changing educational scenario.

3. Principal himself collects the student's feedback on teaching learning.

5. Analysis of progress report of students by the faculties in their respective departments.
6. Holding of administrative feedback meeting.
7. Personal monitoring of the college account maintained by the Accountant.

The curriculum development is the responsibility of the Gauhati University. As an affiliated college, it follows the curriculum prescribed by the Gauhati University.

The departments arrange the date and time of unit tests as prescribed by the examination cell of the college. After the examinations are over the answer scripts are evaluated as per the rules and regulation of Gauhati University.

Charitable Trust.

2. Goal

To provide service to the underprivileged class of the society.

3. The Context

The college has a Charitable Trust to provide need based service to the poor and underprivileged class of people living in the greater Bhawanipur area. The Trust provides financial support and counseling to the people how to be self sufficient by doing small profit oriented business. Besides it provides financial assistance to the guardians of the poor students to seek medical care in case of deadly diseases.
