- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The curriculum development is the responsibility of the Gauhati University. As an affiliated college, it follows the curriculum prescribed by the Gauhati University. However, if there is a change in curriculum the faculty members of respective departments thoroughly discuss it and make necessary arrangement for effective implementation of the curriculum.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- 2. Teachers use lecture method of teaching in the classroom and advanced technology (Audio Visual Aids) during seminar classes.
- 3. Transparent evaluation of the answer scripts for internal examinations.

- 5. The faculty members prepared the teaching plan on the basis of academic calendar.
- 6. Organising special lecture programme for students.
- 7. Conducting unit tests, group discussions, and home assignments.
- 8. Organised educational trips for the students.
- 9. Motivating students for research activities.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The details of the internal and external examination date are published in the academic calendar which is provided to the students along with the prospectus at the time of admission. The departments arrange the date and time of seminar classes, submission of home assignments, holding sessional examinations, unit tests as prescribed by the examination cell of the college. After the examinations are over the answer scripts are evaluated as per the rules and regulation of Gauhati University.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The college has a Research Publication and Publicity Cell under IQAC. The cell motivates the teachers to undertake research projects and other research works for their career advancement. It also guides the teachers for improving API through participation in conferences, publishing book and research papers, writing in college magazine.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has a well equipped computerised library. At present it has 18786 (Eighteen Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Six) books, journals, and reference books. The works on digital library is going on. The college authority is planning to introduce ICT based library services by the next year including Bar Coding, OPAC system for searching books.

The physical infrastructure of the college has been expanded with a Boys Hostel, One indoor Stadium and one Outdoor Stadium. Uninterrupted power supply to the entire infrastructure is given by the help of an eco friendly power generator.

## **Best Practice-2**

#### 1. Title of the Practice

CC Camera Surveillance of the College Campus for Checking the problem of Ragging/Protecting the Dignity of the Community of Girl Students/Overall Discipline/and Protecting the Cleanliness and Campus Order.

#### 2. Goal

Close circuit cameras have been installed in the college to monitor and totally check the problem of Ragging, Protecting the Dignity of the Community of Girl Students, maintaining overall Discipline and Protecting/maintaining the Swachhata i.e. Cleanliness parameter of the Campus and maintaining Order.

#### 3. The Context

The college has a sprawling campus and it is very difficult for the principal, concerned persons of the administration to personally monitor and check the problem of Ragging, Protect the Dignity of the Community of Girl Students, maintain overall Discipline and Protect the Swachhata i.e. Cleanliness of the Campus, maintain Order, observe the curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities of the students and the staff members. Considering all the necessities and for strict vigilance of the campus activity in the day time and campus security at night, CC cameras have been installed in the classrooms, library and other sensitive points of the college.

#### 4. The Practice

This practice has been enforced to maintain the academic and natural health of the institution by helping in avoiding any type of untoward incidents in the college campus. However, for maximum benefit out of this provision, notice has been displayed in various points so that everybody comes to know that the total Campus area is under CC Surveillance.

#### 5. Evidence of Success

After the enforcement of CC camera surveillance, it has been noticed that the activities of the students and the staff members have become more disciplined. Ragging and Teasing have totally been disappeared from the campus and Swachhata i.e. Cleanliness has been confirmed.

#### 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The first and foremost problem encountered in effective implementation of this practice is frequent disruption of power supply, lack of technical knowhow to operate the system and for managing promptly the minor/major technical error of the system. In such situation the authority has to seek the help of the technical experts on payment which creates extra financial burden.

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## BHAWANIPUR ANCHALIK COLLEGE

Students' Feedback Report

Session: 2015-16

Keeping in mind for the systematic evaluation of the Quality Parameters and taking necessary steps for the overall uplift, the IQAC has regularly been collecting Feedback from the Stakeholders viz. From Students, Guardians and Alumni with the help of well developed Scale as per the UGC/NAAC directions. For the Session 2015-16 such Feedbacks on Curriculum, Syllabus, Infrastructural Facilities and Performance of the Teachers have been collected and analysed result has been reported as:

## **Feedback Analysis of the Students:**

Most of the students expressed highly positive views/opinions on the increased/renovated infrastructural facilities. They expressed satisfaction over the issue of teaching-learning facilities and process followed by the teachers. However some of the students expressed dissatisfaction relating to the suitability of the syllabus. They express doubt relating to the market value of some of the contents of the designed syllabus and demand changes as per the requirement of the knowledge market. The Affiliating University has frequently been informed about the views of the students for making changes of the contents.

#### **Feedback Analysis of the Guardians:**

The guardians have expressed high satisfaction over the available infrastructural facilities of the college. They are delighted having a very Clean and Natural Campus. They appreciate the overall roles and involvement of the principal in the college, teachers in the classrooms and the outside. However, there is the suggestion for especial measures for the proper continuation of late hour classes.

#### Feedback Analysis of the Alumni:

Alumni's views relating to the rapid infrastructural changes are very positive. They expressed surprised observing the overall changes of the infrastructural facilities of the college during the short span of time. However, there is the demand from the Alumni side for a separate well equipped Room for their sitting.

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
